





It's time for our stated meetings already! I would like to open in Full Form with rituals so the new officers can get used to how it is done and work on their parts.







migrant workers children. Well, several other US students pulled the Mexican flag down and were promptly sent home for violating the civil rights of the Mexican student. What civil rights? You or I would have no civil rights in Mexico! Human rights questionable! Civil rights; I doubt very highly. Our Harley brother wants us to: "take back America, speak English and stop bending to the will of foreign visitors who don't like us. "Forget the notion they will ever like us. They are jealous and will never, ever change. Americans don't take siestas in the afternoon when there is work to be done. Now this brings up another point of interest. Work ethics! Working at an elderly high rise, I'm frequently asked to enter apartments where older people, many very old and quite feeble, live. Many are supplied insurance paid aides several times a week to make life more comfortable, bearable and hygienic. Many times I perform maintenance while this aide is assisting the occupant. I was quickly informed that I was living in some sort of a time warp. "It's vogue to have an ear piece and cell phone even while doing other things." So they walk around talking to themselves leaving others wondering. Well, I think they misspelled the word vogue, it should be spelled 'r-u-d-e.' Believe me, I worked 50 years in industry, 35 of those years in supervision and I know a split second's lost attention can make the difference between a near miss and a tragic accident. There was a news article about the bride's cell phone ringing during the wedding. Something old, something new, something borrowed and something blue plus your cell phone. Even the Minister's phone rang during the ceremony! Riding public transportation day after day, one gets familiar with and notes the habits of those around you. One fellow in particular, who is texting all the time, rode several stops beyond his location because of his lack of attention. Another incident has an aide walking a hallway, her nose in her cell phone texting, tripped over a maintenance cart. She looked as if it were my fault. My answer: get you nose off the phone and watch where you're going. Where are we going with this phenomenon? Geeze! Enough is enough! Are we going to have cell phone implants in our brains?
