Greetings brethren and Happy Holidays to each of you and to your families! First, on behalf of myself and the new officers of William McKinley Lodge, I want to thank each of you for your confidence in electing us to serve as stewards of our great and historic lodge. 

Masonic Christmas Morning Breakfast With the Reverend Elden Smith





Reverend Elden Smith

Reverend Elden Smith will be the guest speaker at the 2010 Masonic Christmas Morning Breakfast. In tradition as other years, this celebration is for all Masons and their male guests; and as usual, in by 6:00 a.m. out by 7:00 a.m., allowing enjoyment with family and relatives afterwards. The Reverend Elden Smith was raised on a farm in southern Wisconsin and after graduation from high school, worked in sales, retail management and meatpacking for 15 years. Having actively served in church related -ministries for many years; and having received his undergraduate training from American Christian College in Tulsa, OK, and a Master of Divinity degree from Reformed Presbyterian Theo-

logical Seminary in Pittsburgh, PA., the Reverend Smith answered the call to pastoral ministry in 1987.

The Reverend Smith has had pastoral duties in congregations in northeastern Ohio and Southeastern Pennsylvania. He presently is senior pastor at Faith Community Church of Canton, OH (formerly Canton Christian Tabernacle.) He has also served on several organizational boards including Child Evangelism Fellowship, Bucks Mont Collation for Evangelism and his denomination's national board of directors. He also served for several years as a chaplain for a local service organization. Reverend Smith and his wife Carol, make their home in Jackson Township.

Kwanzaa

Lighting the first Kinara candle strikes the beginning of the Kwanzaa celebrations in the United States. The kinara is the candle holder. Its divergent shape represents the roots that African Americans have to continental Africa. During the week-long celebration of Kwanzaa, seven candles are placed in the kinara, three red on the left, three green on the right and a single black candle in the center; the symbolic colors of the holiday. The seven candles represent the Seven Principles of Kwanzaa. During the week of Kwanzaa, a new candle is lit each day. The center black candle first, than alternates between the red and green beginning with the outermost red candle and moving towards the center. Each day is dedicated to the contemplation of one of the "seven principles" with each candle having a meaning. The black symbolizes the African race, red stands for African blood shed and green stands for the land of Africa.

The ritual of lighting the kinara closely resembles that of the Menorah during the Jewish holiday of Hannukah. What a small world it really is.

The point of the humor was that some change is necessary for an organization to succeed. I agree with that premise.

We will continue to hold our traditional events such as the very moving memorial service, the William McKinley observance and Holiday party. Traditionally, all Masonic Temples, designed by professional architects in the 20's and 30's and indeed possibly even

today, have a mistake purposely built into the building. The Masonic reasoning behind this is that only God can produce and build something that is perfect. All Persian rugs have a defect woven into their pattern, for the same reason and one of the things that makes them valuable to the consumer. The human eye is a strange devise for detecting some small flaw in an otherwise perfect repeating pattern and will pass right over it without registering that small flaw on the brain and therefore, the flow may go undetected to many while others may recognize the "so called error" at once. In the case of the Masonic Temples, this error is placed in full view in an open area, of each Masonic Temple, and is not hidden by any other objects to obscure its view. It may be seen by just walking past that area. Now, our Masonic Temple has just such a "so called error" built into the building. Excluding the personnel who visit the structure on a daily or weekly basis, do you know where this purposefully placed error is located in our grand old building? If you do, you have a head up on the rest of the rank and file who visit and walk through her halls on a regular basis. Point it out to those near you or better yet, write the editor and tell all where it is. Even better than that, take a brother to lodge and show him where this error is located and give him a reason to have pride in this very valuable place on the corner of 9th Street and Market Avenue North.
