Greetings Brethren! I hope this month's Bulletin finds everyone in good spirits and health. Those of you who have traveled with me this past inspection season know that I tell everyone that the Canton Temple is located in downtown Canton where the sun is always shining and there is a warm breeze blowing. Well with cold temperatures and snow flurries into April, I had doubts if that was simply wishful thinking.

This month I would like to share some thoughts about our core values. One cannot talk about past meetings and not hear a brother say, "I remember when we had the sidelines full and had to come in on Saturdays because we had so many new Masons to raise." Have we lost attendance because we have lost our values? I say no, and that Masonry is as important today as it was in the past.

In 1717 the Grand Lodge of England was formed at the Apple Tree tavern. This date is considered the beginning of speculative Masonry. Very few institutions today, or historically can proclaim such longevity. No institution exists this long unless it has strong values.

The three great tenants of a Mason are brotherly love, relief and truth. These are simple and pragmatic beliefs, but they have endured and cemented us into a society of brothers for

over three hundred years. These beliefs constitute our core values and define who we are. These are the ideals that have drawn good men to our Masonic family.

One example is our own William McKinley. During the Civil War, McKinley,


The Blue Lodge inspections are moving along. Very good work is being conferred by all. I hear Canton 60 passed with flying colors. Great job No. 60!

who was not then a Mason, observed a Union army surgeon befriending the Confederate wounded. The Surgeon gave the wounded money and tobacco. McKinley inquired of the doctor. The doctor replied that the wounded were brother Masons and it was not only his duty but his pleasure to do so. McKinley, so impressed by this unselfish example of brotherly love, asked to become a Mason. McKinley was initiated into Hiram Lodge No. 21 on May 1st, 1865. This is simply one of many stories of the Civil War.

This year, the 150th anniversary of the beginning of the Civil War, many events are planned by different groups throughout Ohio. Our Lodge is no exception. We will hold an Outdoor Lodge and raise a Master Mason in Civil War style, Saturday, June 18th at the farm of Brother, Bill Bird. Lunch, with food representative of that period, will be served at High Noon and Lodge will open at 1:30 p.m. What an opportunity to fellowship with good and trustworthy friends and especially brother Masons.

Our event however is different than that of other groups. It is not a celebration of the start of the war, but rather the core values of brotherly love, relief and truth, that were exemplified during that war by Masons on both sides. Although they were in the midst of a war, with strong emotions, these men continued to practice the ideals that first drew them to Masonry. The Decree of Cyrus and the Second Temple

Editor's note: In past issues we have presented the size, grandeur, Holy of Holies and construction of King Solomon's Temple. We know that Cyrus, King of all Persia, released the Jews from cavity to return to Jerusalem to rebuild the "House of the Lord." In this issue we explore the history of the return to Jerusalem and the rebuilding of the second temple.

King Solomon's Temple, Symbol of Freemasonry.

by R.W. Bro. Don Falconer, Chapter Thirty-Nine of the book: The Square and Compasses - In search of Freemasonry

Cyrus came to the throne of Anshan, an Islamite region, in about 559 BCE and clashed with a Median king. Cyrus captured the walled city of Ecbatana (the modern Hamadan) when the Median army rebelled, as a result of which the Persians were then in the ascendancy. Cyrus rapidly extended his conquests, defeating Croesus the king of Lydia about 546 BCE and conquering Babylon in 539 BCE. Thus Cyrus established the vast Persian Empire, which held dominion over Judea as a province for the next two centuries. Cyrus established his capital at Pasargadae in the land of Persia, from where he ruled until his death in 530 BCE. In 538 BCE Cyrus issued the following decree releasing the Jews who were in exile in Babylon:

"Thus saith Cyrus King of Persia, all the kingdoms of the earth hath Jehovah, the God of heaven, given me; and he hath charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whosoever there is among you of all his people, his God be with him and let him go to Jerusalem and build the house of Jehova."

In total about 42,360 Israelites returned progressively to Jerusalem, under the leadership of Sheshbazzar or Zerubbabel in 535 BCE, under Ezra in 458 BCE and under Nehemiah in 445 BCE.

The first small band that returned to Jerusalem soon began rebuilding the temple, under Jeshua as the high priest and Zerubbabel as the governor. Their meagre resources and the many difficulties they encountered delayed completion of the temple until 515 BCE, almost twenty years after the first group left Babylon, but long before all the exiles had returned from captivity. Indeed, the temple was only completed then because of the efforts of the prophets Haggai and Zechariah, who urged the work on in the later stages. No accurate description of the second temple exists, but the layout appears to have been similar to that of the first temple with the height increased to 60 cubits. However it was much less ornate than King Solomon's temple, lacking the sumptuous finishes and only scantily furnished. A lack of resources probably was the reason why the second temple was not built to Ezekial's grand plan. So far as is known the second temple, like the tabernacle of Israel, had only a curtain at the entrance to the *Holy Place*, one *menorah*, one table of shewbread and a golden altar of incense. Another curtain screened the entrance to the *Holy of Holies*, which was empty. When Nebuchadnezzar sacked Jerusalem in 587 BCE the *Ark of the*

Covenant was destroyed. Nevertheless the second temple, usually referred to as Zerubbabel's temple, survived for almost 500 years, which was much longer than any other temple in Jerusalem. The Roman general Pompey took the temple when he captured Jerusalem in 63 BCE, but did not harm it. However the Roman consul Crassus plundered the temple of all its gold and other valuables nine years later. The second temple was the focus point of the lavish reconstruction and expansion carried out in later years by King Herod.

Friend to Friend Masonic Memorial

The Friend to Friend Masonic Memorial is a monument located in the annex of the Gettysburg National Cemetery in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania. Built by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, it commemorates Confederate Brigadier General Lewis Addison Armistead entrusting Union Captain Henry H. Bingham with his personal effects, most notably a pocket watch, on the third day of the Battle of Gettysburg, during Pickett's Charge.

Pickett's Charge was an assault upon the Union Army center on the last day of the Battle of Gettysburg. The charge, the high tide of the Confederate States of America, was repulsed. Confederate Gen-

eral Armistead, under George Pickett's command, personally led his men up the hill to the Union position. Armistead was shot twice. Severely wounded and fearing his personal effects would be stolen by Union soldiers, "gave a Masonic sign asking for assistance". Union Captain Bingham, an aide to Major General Winfield Scott Hancock, a personal friend of Armistead, came to his aid as he lay wounded. Armistead, Bingham and Hancock were all Freemasons. After ensuring Armistead that his possessions would be sent to his family, particularly his pocket watch, Bingham took Armistead to a field hospital where

Armistead died two days later on the George Spangler farm.

The monument's sculptor was Ron Tunison of Cairo, New York, who was himself a Freemason. The sculpture is made of polychrome bronze.

The statue was dedicated by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania on August 21, 1993.





Editors Comment



Masonry as a whole, taking in all the individual organizations which make up the craft, is experiencing a decline because of an aging membership and the decline of petitioning potential members. Being involved in the business end of several companies for 50 years of my working life, I have witnessed many of the ups and down of business through the years. This never fails to follow certain trends. When sales go down and fewer product is needed, personnel is sacrificed and there is less advertising and fewer people out there selling. Thus the downward spiral begins. Less sales, less people, less product and so on. As I sit in the meetings of the satellite organizations and listen the their pitch for more membership and petitions, I sometimes feel they are missing the obvious fact that all these brethren who petition their satellite organizations, whether Scottish Rite, York Rite, Grotto or any other Masonic group, all come from the "Mother Lodge", Blue Lodge and they do not have the personnel any longer to keep up with the aging population of their area of Freemasonry. They need help; lots of help to turn this trend around.

My belief is that if the membership of all the satellite organizations, seeking new blood for their particular group, would concentrate their effort on the "John Q." public rather then the blue lodges, there would a great many more "salesman" out there impressing the common man of the advantages of this organization. It makes good sense, because as I see it, there is no other way into the Shrine but to start with the first degree in Blue Lodge.

Attendance is another area that needs real attention. Here again new membership will bring new enthusiasm into the lodge room and more members who may seek membership into these other organizations. And the question: will Masonry survive? Of course Masonry will survive! But will it survive as a volatile and community service organization


committed to the betterment of mankind or will it be remembered like many of the other organizations who were large in number but small in real commitment. Making good men better is your choice!
