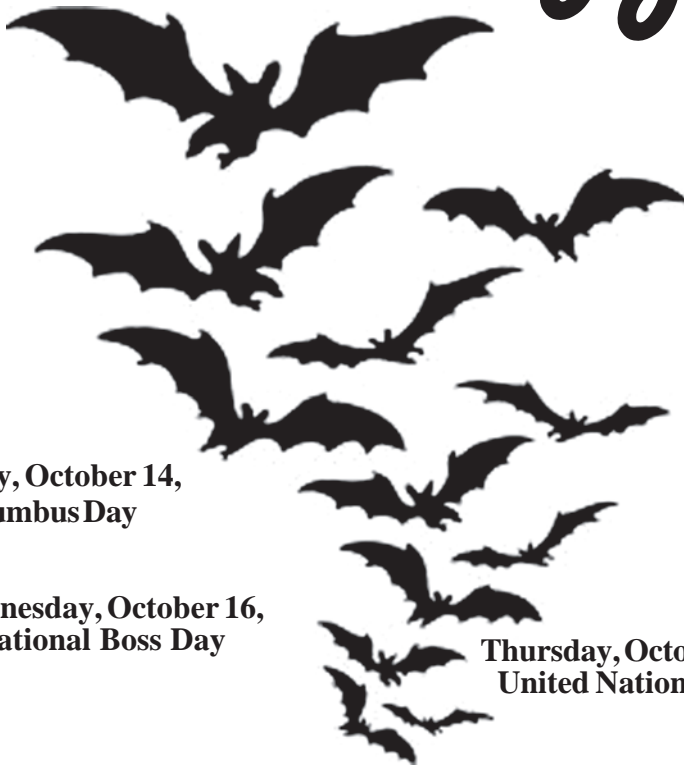

The Legend of the: Third Degree

Author: Unknown

The legend of the third degree is an important Landmark, the integrity of which has been well preserved. There is no rite of Freemasonry, practiced in any country or language, in which the essential elements of this legend are not taught. The lectures may vary, and indeed are constantly changing, but the legend has ever remained substantially the same. And it is necessary that it should be so, for the legend of the Temple Builder constitutes the very essence and identity of Freemasonry. Any rite which should exclude it, or materially alter it, would at once, by that exclusion or alteration, cease to be a Masonic rite.

Anything else is considered un-Masonic conduct and is subject to penalties and punishment by the fraternity.

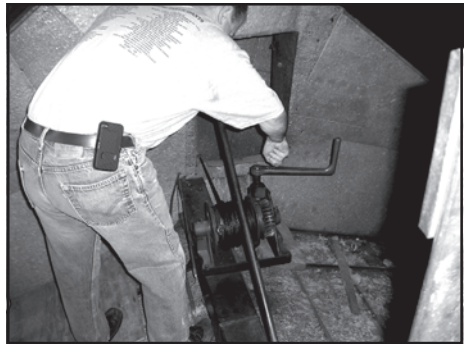


A Tour of the Temple



Many months ago yours truly started a group of articles named “A Tour of the Temple” where I promised to crawl around in all the nooks and crannies, where no one ever goes, take pictures and report my findings to the brethren. Well, important lodge functions, inspection schedules and the “Save the Temple Program” seems to have way-laid my good intentions. To be sure, when I looked up the dates on the first pictures to start that series, they were several years ago. Rats! Time sure flies when you’re having fun.

As chance would have it, one of those articles to be reported was changing the light bulbs in the large chandeliers hanging in the Cathedral Room. Recently, the project appeared again and pictures were taken so I may continue my efforts with articles.



These chandeliers are mammoth in size, contain many light bulbs and must be lowered down to working height. Pictured above is the Cathedral Room ceiling and below the building roof, the guys are



lowering, by means of cable and wench, one of these units to working height. Close to the floor one can see a ten foot ladder must be used to check all the wiring and look inside the units. Pictured from the top are four locations for 500 watt large base



incandescent bulbs. And pictured from the bottom are places for eight 100 watt standard base incandescent bulbs, a total of two thousand eight hundred watts of lighting in each unit! Also pictured are the guys checking the wiring and cleaning the chandeliers before they are raised back



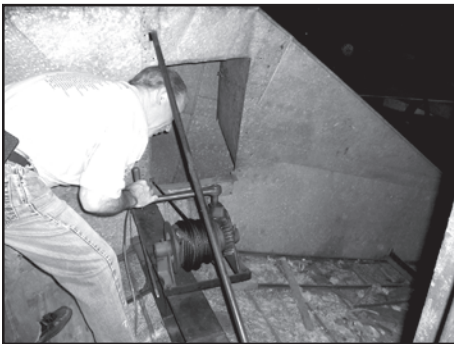

into position. Everyone must take his turn at cranking these units back up. They come down rather easily but going back up is, a very different story. The suspension cable passed over the pulley at the top, shown, down to a pulley inside the fixture and back up to the clamping bracket at the ceiling. This in itself is a two



with the crank to raise the massive fixture one foot. While this is happening, as the pictures show, the fellows are standing on the wire rafters of the Cathedral Room ceiling holding on by their toe nails.



to one mechanical advantage and the wench is constructed with a worm gear which is fifty to one ratio. This means it takes approximately 100 rather hard turns



Also completing this relighting project is the replacement of 176, 100 watt incandescent regular base lamps located in the coves near the ceiling on either side. When completed the results are fantastic. You will see when you attend the Scottish Rite Reunion this October 5th on Saturday morning. **Your Editor, Bobel**
